The Stone Mothers' Club was established in 1924 as a small group of mothers of children who attended the Stone School (a one-room school house). The school closed around 1964, but the Stone Mothers' Club continues to do community service.

The way this free book exchange works is simple:

- We initially stock the Little Free Library (LFL) with a variety of good quality books for children and adults
- You stop by and take whatever catches your fancy
- You choose to return the book or bring a favorite book to share
- Books are always a gift – never for sale and never have a late fee!

Little Free Library is a movement started by Todd Bol of Hudson and Rick Brooks of Madison in 2010, and has grown to include little libraries throughout the United States and 36 countries. Little Free Library's mission is to promote literacy, a love of reading and community-building by supporting free book exchanges worldwide.
