A lot is happening in Rutland in 2024.

Please spread the word by encouraging a few of your neighbors sign up as well. A well-informed community helps your Town Board to work efficiently and positively toward our shared goals.

• In January you will be receiving a survey to gather information that will be used for the update of our Comprehensive Plan. This survey can be filled out online, or you can request a paper copy. The survey will be the guide that the Comprehensive Plan Task Force, working with the Capitol Area Regional Planning Commission, will use to revise and update our Town planning document. The goals and strategies in this document shape land-use decisions and other outcomes that affect us all. Please look over the current Plan at https://town.rutland.wi.us/wpcontent/uploads/2020/06/Rutland-Plan.pdf) - this is your opportunity to express your ideas about how and where Rutland should grow, what should be preserved or protected in our community, what resources we have and need, and what problems need to be addressed. Early this year there will be community meetings to review the draft of the Plan, and the more thoughtful and knowledgeable input we receive, the more successful this effort will be. • We all have something inspiring to look forward to in 2024:

Following voter approval for our new Town Hall/Garage project, the Town is negotiating a construction contract with National Construction. Once that is executed, we will begin the detailed design phase for the new building. Next, specifications and bid packages for all the building components will be developed and issued for bidding responses. National will qualify bidders and compare responses and the Town will award bid



packages. These activities are anticipated to begin in January and run through March. The Building Committee will continue to keep the project website updated with the most current information: townofrutlandwi.gov. Thank you to the Board members and Building Committee who worked so hard to get this accomplished.

More good news:

Rutland is one of three townships in Dane County that are Broadband Forward approved. There were \$242,000,000 in grant applications and only \$42,000,000 will be awarded, so keep your fingers crossed. This is just phase one of the grant process. Phase two is the BEAD Grant (Broadband Equity, Access and Development) - there is over 1 billion dollars for this grant for the state of Wisconsin alone. The application process for this will begin early this Spring. Joshua

Notice Town of Rutland Residents Collection Center Drop Off Fees

By order of the Rutland Town Board, Effective January 1, 2024, Town of Rutland residents will be charged the following fees for the specific items listed below when brought to the Rutland Collection Center.
